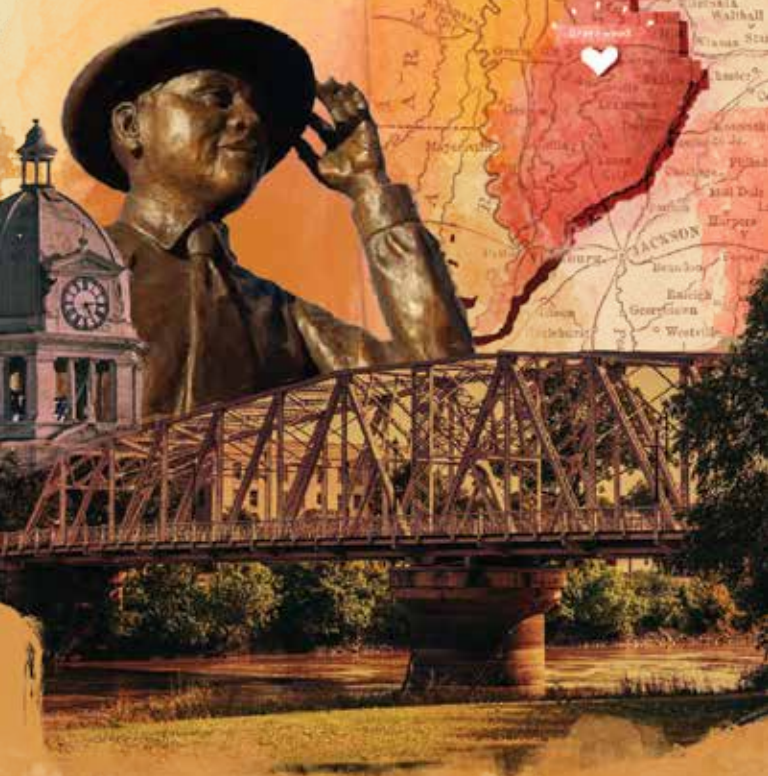


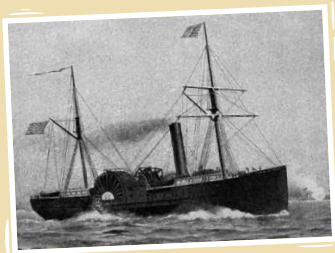

EMMETT TILL,

a Chicago teenager whose murder rocked the world, spent one of the last nights of his life in Greenwood. Follow Money Road north of town to find the place where America's Civil Rights Movement found its spark.



THE HELP,

nominated for an Academy Award as "Best Picture of 2011," was based on Kathryn Stockett's best-selling novel and filmed almost entirely in Greenwood. Pick up a copy of The Help self-guided tour map to see the familiar sites from the movie.

HUBERT SUMLIN,

listed as one of Rolling Stone magazine's "100 Greatest Guitarists of All Time," was born in Greenwood in 1931. His Blues Trail marker over-looks the timeless Yazoo River.



BOBBIE GENTRY,

whose haunting "Ode to Billie Joe" rocketed up the music charts in 1967, centered her song around Greenwood's Tallahatchie Bridge. You'll find her Mississippi Country Music Trail marker on the north end of tree-lined Grand Boulevard.

Tucked away in the curves of three rivers, just a few miles from where the Mississippi Delta gives way to the bluffs, Greenwood pulls natives and newcomers into a land of blues and cypress swamps, to-die-for food, luxuriant spas and one-of-a-kind shops. Whether you're looking for a weekend at Mississippi's most celebrated hotel, an easy stroll through a century of fine architecture or a trek down dusty roads along the Blues Trail, you've come to the right place.

Follow Your Heart

THE ONLY STATUE HONORING EMMETT TILL WAS UNVEILED IN GREENWOOD IN 2022. Located in Rail Spike Park at 209 W. Johnson street, it commemorates the powerful story of Emmett Till that started at Bryant's Grocery and culminated with Stokely Carmichael's "Black Power" speech at Broad Street Park. Greenwood residents have had a front-row seat to witness the gradual yet undeniable shift in the tides of justice. The statue acknowledges the galvanizing impact that Emmett Till had in igniting the Civil Rights movement.

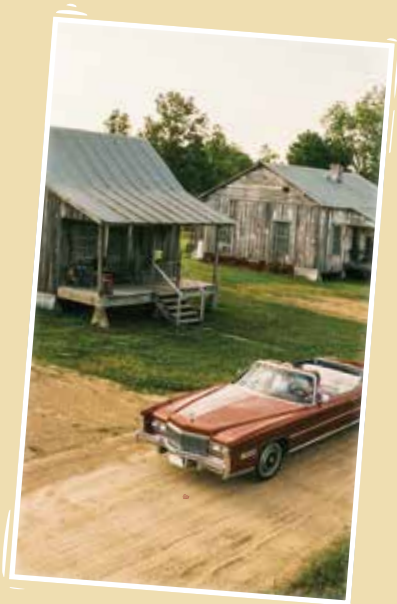

The lush parkland between Greenwood's downtown bridges has developed into a popular spot for walking, gathering for festivals and river watching. The boat ramp is available for those with watercraft to put in and head downstream or upstream to Point Leflore, where the three rivers merge.

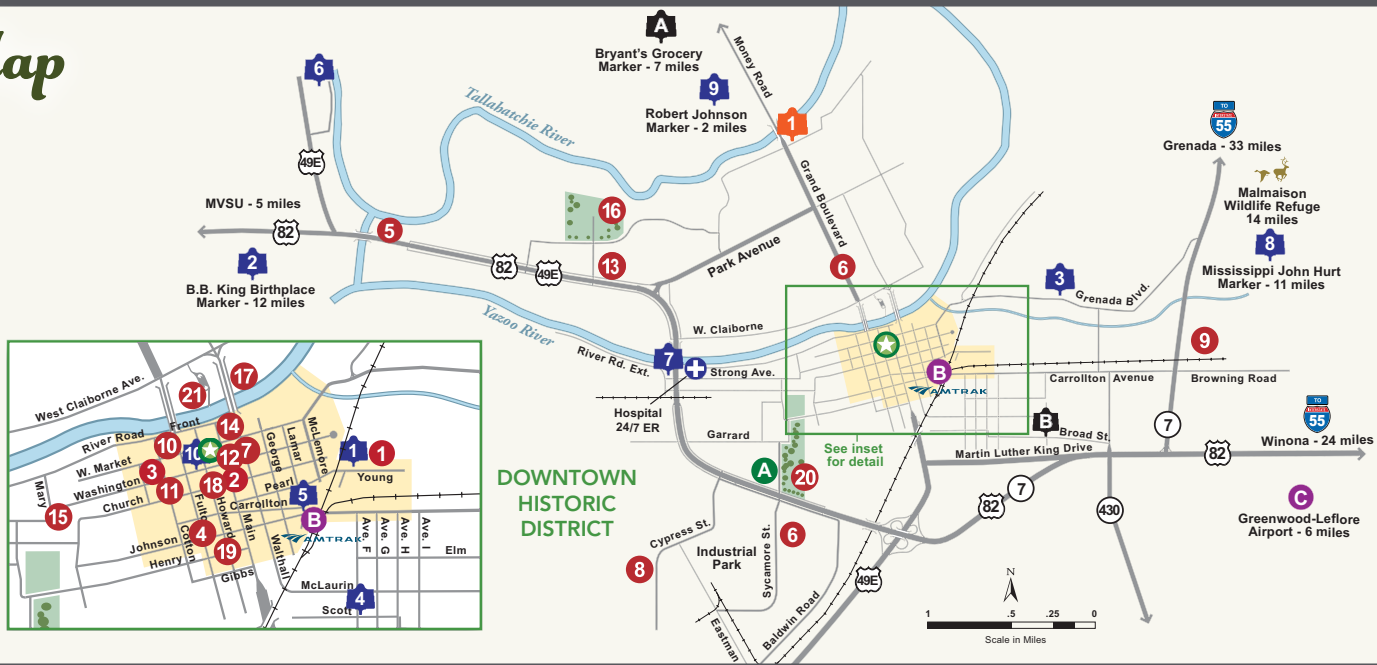
